Brewster Good Neighbor Fund

General Information

Residents are eligible for financial assistance for urgent situations that would help them to avoid a crisis such as homelessness or loss of heat, as well as non-urgent situations such as assistance with childcare, after school care, summer programs, utility bills, medical bills, etc. Brewster Town Staff are available to meet or talk with residents of all ages to provide information, support, referrals, and assist residents in the Good Neighbor fund application process.

Requirements for Good Neighbor funds

- Have lived in Brewster for at least 3 months (exceptions can be made based on Staff recommendation).
- Meet financial eligibility criteria for household size. Household income must be at or below 110% Area Median Income, for Barnstable County, and under savings thresholds. See chart below.
- Able to provide verification of residency, income, and expenses through residency documents, bank statements, pay stubs, tax return, etc.
- Other available funding sources are being considered.

Applying for Brewster Good Neighbor Fund

- Complete application.
- Submit application to: neighborfund@brewster-ma.gov
- Brewster staff will contact applicants by phone or email for initial interview, possible referral, and required documentation.
