*PAPER NOTE: Metal spirals, paper clips, window envelopes, staples can remain with paper items listed, but should be minimized & removed if easy.

ACCEPTING ORGANICS

We'll take all food waste including fruits, vegetables, meats, dairy products, table scraps, eggshells, coffee grinds, etc. If it was previously any kind of food or drink, we can take it, EXCEPT:

- NO LARGE bones such as ham, beef, lamb
- NO PLASTIC containers, wraps or bags of any type or size.

<u>Home composting</u> is still a great way to recycle your organics and even more environmentally friendly!

HOUSEHOLD BATTERIES

ALL batteries, including auto, are accepted for recycling at the Brewster Recycling Center. Check with an attendant for bin location.

LIGHTBULBS

Incandescent light bulbs and LED bulbs are trash for your yellow PAYT bag.
Fluorescent tubes & bulbs should be handed to the attendant.

TEXTILES BANNED EFFECTIVE 11/01/22

Clean and dry CLOTHING, SHOES, SHEETS, LINENS, TOWELS, ETC. MUST be recycled using the on-site donation boxes, local thrift shops, or some local animal/wildlife rescue shelters.

FEE ITEMS

Many items are recyclable that aren't listed on this guide. Generally, bulky waste, incl. furniture and large toys, mattresses, yard cleanup materials, trimmings, scrap metal, electronics, auto tires & fluids are recycled, but require a fee. Please visit Brewster recycling center fees for a complete list.

HAZARDOUS WASTE

The County hosts multiple yearly Hazardous Waste Collection Days; check it out <u>yearly</u>. <u>Barnstable County's Hazardous Waste 2023 Collection Schedule - Barnstable County: Barnstable County</u>

- 1. Deposit bottles can be taken to a Redemption Center.
- 2. If unsure where to place an item, ask a Recycling Center attendant.
- 3. See attendants for small, non-container metal items like empty aerosol cans, empty paint cans, coat hangers, cooking pots/pans, etc. They will direct you accordingly.
- 4. Unused, small foam pieces <u>including meat trays</u>, go in the yellow PAYT bag; larger, bulky, foam packaging pieces can be tossed into trash receptacle loose.
